SAN ANTONIO TOURING -

REUNION SPECIAL – After a day long tour of the National Museum of the Pacific War (Nimitz Museum) enjoying a day on your own in San Antonio is about organizing your interests your interests.

The **Riverwalk** is rich with shops and places to eat and likely some art and craft shops as well. The inner 5 miles is likely your target for this excursion. Foot traffic along is light until

noon, then pickup noon to 3. Busiest time is evening 6pm to 930pm.

UNESCO Missions, five total, will take some tour expertise. Check Grey Line or Hop on Hop off narrated tours to capture the Missions, architecture and historic Aqueducts Espada and Acequia.

Pearl District food and walking tour (munch and march) is a great way to cruise this section of the city. About \$44 pp to do this tour.

Art is alive in the **San Antonio Art museum** - \$17 for a two- hour timed slot to see art and samurai collections. Not far away is the Buckhorn Saloon and Texas Ranger Museum. \$22 pp.

Brackenridge Park is a district of the city and a 343-acre green space think Balboa Park in San Diego. This is a restful venue packed central park for an hour or an afternoon. A tour gives you transportation, local expertise and time management plus the sights you want to see. San Antonio is a historic location packed with all the sights and sounds of the Southwest.

FRANK KNOX EXTERIOR PLANS

– This photo in the Chicago Sun-Times from April 1962 shows the first CO of FRANK KNOX receiving a scale model of the ship from a hobbyist. Thanks to Bill Atkinson we now have exterior plans for FRANK KNOX as built in 1944. Using these plans you can build your own ship's model. The plans were reproduced from the original set at Bath Iron Works, Bath Maine. They include detailed views of the ship's starboard side, top view of the ship and detailed plans for the armament, radars, depth charge racks and twin torpedo tubes. You can pair drawings with actual photos of the ship's equipment. Look for our progress reported in this newsletter and on the website ussfrankknox.com

We are on the lookout for more drawings, especially interior compartments, from the original ship's design as well as the first



upgrades to the ship completed at Mare Island shipyard, 1952 and 1961. Please support our work documenting the ship's design and history. Consider an annual membership, or donation, to Frank Knox Reunion Association. Your donation helps support conservation work.

visitor since opening in June 2004. To visit USS FRANK KNOX you will have to dive 250-300 feet down near the Island of Crete in the Mediterranean Sea.

USS FRANK KNOX AWARDS – Background

U.S. NAVY "E" – FRANK KNOX Nine "E" Awards. The original "E" award was titled Army Navy "E" Award, for excellence in War Production. The program began in July 1942, an honor presented to top performers of the civilian war industry. At the time, Frank Knox was Secretary of the Navy and head of the Wartime Production Board.

The Navy Unit Award ribbon began March 1976 to replace the old "E" sewn on the uniform of enlisted E1-E6 of ships winning the award. Ships began receiving Battle "E"s for best in squadron dating back to around 1957. Naval Construction (SeaBee) began the tradition in 1963.USS FRANK KNOX DDR 742 (and DD-742) was awarded 9 Battle "E"s. The criteria states "overall readiness of the command to carry out its assigned wartime tasks, and is based on a year-long evaluation." The award "recognizes sustained fast and winning performance in an operational environment within a command." In 1968 USS FRANK KNOX received the Battle "E" mid-year after returning from Vietnam duty earlier in the year.

MARJORIE STERRETT Battleship Fund Award – Presented annually by the CNO to one ship in the Atlantic and one ship in the Pacific fleet. The recipient is the ship with the highest score in the annual competition for the Battle "E". The award rotates among various type commands – carriers, submarines, amphibs etc. In 1963 FRANK KNOX received this honor. The fund award began in 1917 by the New York Tribune Association. The namesake, Marjorie Sterrett, was 13 when she wrote to the Tribune and offered her weeks allowance (ten cents) to "build a battleship for Uncle Sam." Newspapers love stories like this; her February 4, 1916 letter inspired a lot of patriotism in America's youth before the U.S. entered WWI, April 6, 1917.


ARLEIGH BURKE FLEET TROPHY -

Awarded to USS FRANK KNOX November 1968. The award is given annually to the ship, or air unit, demonstrating the greatest improvement in battle efficiency over the previous year. Two commands annually receive the award, one from each coast.

ADM Arleigh "31 kt" Burke, the award's namesake, graduated from Annapolis June 1923 and was ordered to USS Arizona. His assignments were difficult and dirty but received much praise from superiors. Later he would make contributions in key warfare areas including battle efficiency, new tactical concepts and weapons systems.

By June 1943 Commodore Burke and DESRON 23 the Little Beavers; were assigned to Admiral Halsey's task force. In November 1943, during the Battle of Cape ST George, the squadron engaged two enemy destroyers and three destroyer transports. In what was described by tacticians as "near perfect surface actions", the squadron sank three enemy destroyers, and damaged one, without damage

to themselves. In the period November 1943 – February 1944, the Little Beavers fought in 22 separate engagements and were credited with destroying one Japanese cruiser, nine destroyers, one submarine, several smaller ships, and approximately 30 aircraft. Burke is 4th in from the left, just left of the life ring.

SHIP OF THE YEAR – OUR NAVY MAGAZINE – Our Navy Magazine recognized USS FRANK KNOX as "Ship of the Year" in the January 1964 issue following the ship's recognition of the highest scores during the Battle Efficiency competition. Our Navy began publication in 1897 as bimonthly publication. The Ship of the Year may have started around 1960, however the history is unclear. A ship of the year was named annually to stimulate competition among units. Ship of the Year is a significant and unique award to add to a ship's resume.

ON BOARD SALVAGE CREW -

Special Certificate by USS Frank Knox Reunion Association awarded to officers and crew who volunteered to remain aboard following the grounding on Pratas Reef Sunday July 18, 1965. 95 officers and enlisted personnel volunteered to remain aboard to provide life support for the stricken destroyer during typhoon season. The initial 95 salvage volunteers shrank to around 34 personnel as salvage and foaming operations wound down. On Tuesday August 24th the ship was refloated and towed to Kaohsiung, Taiwan for initial dry docking and inspection. The officers and men invested everything to keep the ship alive and supporting operations. 155 crew were evacuated July 21, 1965, by HC-1 to USS MIDWAY CV-41.

Emergency diesel operations #2, and boiler #4 provided essential power for many operations. The transfer of steel and support equipment to the ship was managed by the boatswain's mates and other available personnel. These earned the title "On Board Salvage Crew" and our custom certificate to remember their trials and success and celebrate their success. Some, but not all, were invited to the "Royal Reef Runners" party a year later in Yokosuka. The party gathered celebrated the successful salvage of the ship. Sadly, some salvage personnel transferred to other units and missed the party. It was quite a party according to Roger Mullenix MM3 who attended.

PASSING OF A FRIEND -

It is bad enough to lose Don Critz, QM3 and Ted Hallman. Now, word arrives that Kelly Goddard, YN2, the captain's bridge talker aboard USS GRAPPLE ARS-7, has passed away. GRAPPLE was one of the key salvage vessels assisting FRANK KNOX. He was on the bridge with the Captain of GRAPPLE from July 19, 1965 – August 24, 1965, relaying orders for almost every tow, storm and coordinated effort for the grounded destroyer. After grounding on July 18^{th,} at 0234 the arrival of two tugs, COCOA and MUNSEE, plus the salvage vessel USS GRAPPLE ARS-7, brought needed help and equipment to the scene. GRAPPLE's CO became on-scene commander. The Seventh Fleet Salvage Officer, LCDR Boyd, arrived around four hours later aboard the destroyer STRAUSS, to assume direction of the salvage operations. Goddard recalled the early conversations on the destroyer conversations between his commander and LCDR Boyd. The key question was how bad is it?

Bad is relative, however the typhoon rich South China Sea would play a major role in harassing the salvage ships, personnel and most of the well-intentioned plans made to salvage FRANK KNOX. The "school" solutions to salvage FRANK KNOX from Pratas Reef were damaged or interrupted by weather.

On the FRANK KNOX, the engineering personnel had to rely on the unflooded after fireroom and a leaking number 4 boiler and a good number 3 (for reserve) to provide steam to turbines and electrical generation. Number 4 was the steam generation source for the duration of the salvage. During boiler down-times the ship's emergency diesel was fired up and ran and ran. Boatswain's mates handled all manner of heavy, bulky equipment and containers during foul weather, with few occasional calms. Starting July 26th the arrival of salvage equipment, steel material to strengthen the ship and many tons of foam materials to buoy and dewater the ship pushed their duties beyond anything they had experienced. Rigging and changing towing combinations required added work and skills. The motor whaleboat made endless trips near the dangerous reef, and once, a journey from FRANK KNOX to GRAPPLE for shelter during a typhoon. The return of the three-man crew took several days, The motor whale boat returned when seas calmed.

Despite terrible weather and backbreaking work, salvage personnel not part of the Frank Knox crew could return to their ships, clean sheets, hot chow, and freshwater showers. The KNOX crew had food transported by boat, or helo, (often cold), laundry was shipped out and back by helo. Many berthing compartments were flooded. Sleeping on open decks was almost a necessity to ease heat and humidity. Noise and operations continued, nonstop, to free the ship. Rest, or sleep if you were tired enough, was fitful and often interrupted.

Goddard drove 6 hours one way with his brother Butch, to visit with, and salute, the crew members of FRANK KNOX. Goddard joined a reunion program that included BTC Don Greer, BMCS Richard Swaney and BT1 Mike Haloski. Using Navy photos ,and the salvage report, the group spoke in detail about their experience. Their families heard and saw for the first time how exceptional their performance was. Goddard concluded "I have never seen such and outstanding crew and team work more deserving of recognition than these men."

Below is the note received announcing Goddard's passing.

Mr. Landers,

My name is Michael Goddard and I'm writing on behalf of my father, Melvin Kelly Goddard. I regret to inform you my father passed away on March 6. I want to thank you and the other crew members of the U.S.S. Frank Knox for the friendship and brotherhood you provided my dad. He was proud to have served and was very fond of the reunion event he attended a couple of years ago. I hope your auction was successful.



Call for Reef Runners

If you are one you know it. If not, few remain who remember the 38-day struggle named the "most dramatic and successful ship salvage in the 20th century". Kelly Goddard's Navy salvage ship USS GRAPPLE ARS7 was first to arrive to lend assistance. They served as on scene commander during the initial salvage phase. Goddard was the 2012 WV State Commander. He traveled to Wilmington NC "because I wanted to meet and talk with the men who lived aboard that stranded ship. It was rough on us; the typhoons were scary. It must have been hell on them for 38 days."

A year after the salvage, a ROYAL REEF RUNNERS invitation was circulated in Yokosuka to men who served in the salvage fleet and support and to members of the On Board Salvage Crew living on the grounded destroyer. Living on board were: Don Greer BT3, Rich Huehn YN3, Mike Haloski BT3, Gary Platou SFSN, Lionel Price ENS, Bob Harp EM3, Gary Johnson ,EM3, Roger Mullinix FN, Ed Reid ENS, Darrel Hawk SFP3, Guy Stacy QM2, Rick Swaney BM3, Mike Loy LTjg, Veith LT, Darrell Patterson BM2, Marshall BM2, Jon Osborne, CSSN. There are at least 21 others who were on the ship when it was freed from the reef August 24, 1965. There are additional volunteers totaling 95 that remained with the ship at the end of the evacuation by helo to USS MIDWAY. All should be added to this list.
